Rescue ops on for 8 trapped in tunnel in Telangana

Hyderabad, February 22

RESCUE OPERATIONS WERE intensified on Saturday to extract eight people trapped inside the tunnel of the Srisaalam Left Bank Canal (SLBC) project in Nagarkurnool district, the state government said. Telangana Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy told reporters at the accident site in Nagarkurnool district, about 150 km from here, that the state government is taking the help of experts, including those who rescued trapped workers in a similar incident in Uttarakhand last year, and also that of the Indian Army and NDRF.

Two of the trapped are engineers of an infra firm and two are operators, employed with a US company. Four others are labourers. They all belong to Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Punjab and Jammu and Kashmir. Fresh air was being pumped into the tunnel to ensure the safety of those trapped, sources said.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi called up Telangana Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu to inquire about the incident and assured all possible assistance from the Centre for the ongoing rescue operation.

Teams of NDRF and SDRF have reached the spot and a team of army personnel are in its way, a senior police official told PTI.

After the construction work resumed recently, as many as 50 persons went inside the tunnel in the first shift along with the tunnel boring machine which is 200 meter long, on Saturday morning.

Sunil Mittal receives Britain's honourary knighthood medal

Six months on, SUV coupés struggle to drive up sales

Green played the price game by launching the Basalt at just ₹7.99 lakh but compromised on features. Buyers want features, not just affordability. For instance, even though the Creta starts at around ₹11 lakh, more than 30% of its sales come from the top-end SXO variant, which costs over ₹17 lakh.

Unlike the petrol-only Basalt, the Tata Curvv was launched with three powertrain options - petrol starting at ₹9.99 lakh, diesel at ₹11.99 lakh, and electric at ₹17.49 lakh. The launch of Mohan Savarcar, chief product officer & vice-president at Tata Motors, told PTI that the goal was to secure a podium position in the midsize SUV segment. "We have the right product. Unlike other midsize SUVs that have a boxy styling, Curvv is a SUV with a globally aspirational body style." Analysts caution that six months is too short a period to judge a new body style's success against entrenched rivals like Creta or Grand Vitara. "Curvv will build a fan following over time," they said, adding that SUV coupés are a global trend that will likely gain traction in India.

Sum Kapoor, EV India Automotive, Future of Mobility leader (Consulting), and partner, noted that the car of the future won't be limited to conventional SUVs. "New body styles will continue to evolve, and SUV coupés could find their place in the Indian market."

Indian wines stay robust amid global concerns

"Our revenue for the current fiscal will be around ₹200 crore, even with a flat industry, largely due to micro-economic factors. We also recently got listed on BSE, opening up more growth opportunities," added Bharati.

While the industry has primarily been a whisky-consuming market, the landscape is changing today with room for other categories to grow. "Consumers are open to experimenting and not just sticking to traditional drinking patterns and this goes beyond whisky," said Vikram Achanta, founder and CEO of Tulleko, a beverage education, training and consulting services provider, and co-founder of 30 Best Bars India.

Indian wines, bracketed under the 'new world wines' segment are also growing with laurels, including being named among the top 100 wine brands in the world by the Decanter World Wine Awards and the International Wine Challenge. "In light of this, several Indian wine labels are now being exported to markets like Singapore, the UK, and the US, solidifying their place in the global wine landscape," added Achanta.

This comes at a time when the global wine industry is facing several challenges ranging from falling demand to the impact of climate change. According to a report from the World Spirits Alliance released last year, spirits are soon set to overtake wine in terms of volume, with a marked shift in drinking preferences from wine to spirits.

Given the experimental Indian consumer that's continuously questioning Moet Hennessy's force for wines has been on innovation and liquor and product launches. It recently launched Chandon Vintages 2015 to mark Chandon's 10th anniversary in India, crafted from their first-ever harvest at the Nishik vineyard. "We also launched Chandon Aurore, which is our first still wine, a step from the house of Chandon India. In champagnes, we launched Armand de Brignac, which is a luxury champagne, and we see it becoming a huge hit in Indian weddings and high-energy events," Das said, adding that between 2022 and 2023, Moet Hennessy's wine portfolio saw growth of 15% in India, against an almost flat growth of the category. Wine is no longer just about drinking—it's about learning, experiencing, and appreciating, said Mattia Antonio Clancia, co-founder of Cella 33, an import-export and marketing agency that curates and promotes an exclusive selection of champagne, wine and spirits. "Enthusiasm for wine tastings, food pairings, and vineyard visits is increasing, particularly in cities like Mumbai, Delhi, and Bengaluru," he said.

At present, Cella 33 is actively strengthening its presence in India, aligning with the country's evolving wine culture and the growing demand for premium and artisanal wines. "While some of our products are set to officially enter the market in 2025, following the positive response at ProWine Mumbai 2024 (annual wine trade fair), we are already seeing strong interest from key industry players," he

Chouhan gets 'broken & sunk' seat on AI flight



passengers full fare and then makes them occupy defective seats, Chouhan said in a post on X, adding he had boarded the Delhi-bound Air India flight AI-436 from Bhopal. "I was allotted seat number 8C when I reached my seat and sat down. I found that it was broken and sunk. Sitting was uncomfortable," he wrote on X.

When he confronted the crew over the allotment of a defective seat, he was told that the management had been apprised about the condition of the seat, which shouldn't be sold to passengers. The minister claimed several seats on the flight were in a similar condition. "Fellow passengers insisted that I exchange seats with them. I said, 'I am a better one, but didn't want to trouble any of my friends for my own comfort. So, I decided to complete my journey on the same seat,'" he stated.

Chouhan said he assumed Air India's service would have improved after being taken over by the Tata management, but he was disappointed. "Isn't this a form of deception towards passengers?" he asked. "The civil aviation minister's office in a statement said the minister has taken 'swift action' following Chouhan's post regarding Air India. "We spoke to Air India immediately on this issue and instructed them to take necessary action. From outside DGCW will be looking into details of the matter promptly. And I have personally spoken to Shri ji also," Naidu said in a statement.

Meanwhile, a senior Director General of Civil Aviation (DGC) official said it had sought a report from Air India over the incident. However, it did not elaborate further. After Chouhan shared his

experience on X, Air India apologised for the "inconvenience" and ordered a "thorough" probe into the incident. "Air India deeply regrets the inconvenience caused to Hon'ble Union Minister, Shri Shri Singh Chouhan ji on his flight from Bhopal to Delhi. This does not reflect the standard of service strive to provide to our guests, and we are conducting a thorough investigation into the matter to ensure that such incidents are not repeated," an Air India spokesperson said.

Also, taking note of Chouhan's post, Air India replied on X, "Dear Sir, we apologise for the inconvenience caused. Please be rest assured that we are looking into this matter carefully to prevent such occurrences in the future. We also appreciate the opportunity to speak with you, kindly DM us a convenient time to connect."

After Chouhan shared his

statutory provisions and the need for new legal framework, it said. Less than 10 days ago, the committee had asked the I&B ministry on February 13 regarding the amendments needed in the existing laws to clamp down on controversial content in the wake of the emergence of new technology and digital platforms. The panel had specifically raised the issue of allowing Alabadda during a summit last week and I&B Secretary Sanjay Jaiswal also present. After the meeting, the committee wrote to the ministry of electronics and information technology's secretary S. Krishnan over the issue. "In light of the above and growing incidents of misuse of digital and social media platforms, the ministry of electronics and IT is requested to send a brief note to this committee on the efficacy of existing laws to deal with such cases and the need to amend the existing laws/IT Act, 2000, in order to bring such platforms under legal scrutiny," the letter read.

In February 2025, Office memorandum addressed to the Lok Sabha secretary, the I&B ministry has said that high courts and the Supreme Court, MPs and statutory bodies like the National Commission of Women have spoken on the issue. A day before writing to the Parliamentary panel, the ministry had also asked OTT (over-the-top) media platforms to adhere to age-based classification of content and ensure self-regulation. The ministry had just three days ago on February 19 asked social media channels and OTT platforms to follow the Code of Ethics prescribed in the IT Rules 2021 and implement "access control for A-rated content" to prevent children from consuming inappropriate material. It emphasised that the law requires OTT platforms to "not transmit or procure content which is prohibited by law (and) undertake age-based classification of content" and cited "the provisions of the Indecent Representation of Women Act, 1986, Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023, Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, and Information Technology (IT) Act, 2000, wherein publication of obscene/pornographic content is a punishable offence."

While the SC granted Alabadda protection from arrest, it also came down heavily on him for his comments during India's Got Talent programme and asked the Centre if it was planning to take steps to regulate "obscene" content online. The court also said it would not "leave a vacuum" and take action if needed. After the court's questions to the Centre, the parliamentary panel asked the ministry of electronics and information technology to submit a note on the efficacy of existing laws in dealing with such cases and suggest amendments to bring online platforms under legal scrutiny. The 18th ministry, on its part, told the committee it will submit a detailed note after due deliberations. Under Part III of the Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code (IT

Rules, 2021), online streaming platforms are required to implement a three-level grievance redressal mechanism for violations of the Code of Ethics. This Code also prohibits platforms from transmitting unlawful content, mandates age-based classification, and restricts access to A-rated content for children.

However, the rule requiring the creation of the three-tier grievance redressal mechanism—which involves self-regulation at the platform's level, industry self-regulation, and an oversight mechanism by the government—has been questioned by the Bombay High Court and Madras High Court. The Kerala High Court has also restrained coercion over non-compliance with Part III of the IT Rules. More than 15 petitions have been filed against these rules, and in 2021, the Centre approached the Supreme Court, which has since then been challenged to the top court to avoid "divergent judicial views." The Supreme Court has since transferred those petitions to the Delhi High Court, where hearing is currently ongoing.

While YouTube is governed under the digital media and ethics code of the IT Rules, the provisions can only apply to content created by the platform. For content uploaded to an individual's channel, YouTube will not be treated as a publisher, but rather as a social media intermediary since such content falls under the provisions of the IT Rules, which cannot be held liable for as long as it adheres to certain government directions, such as blocking content and other due diligence requirements.

Das was named the top banker globally by Global Finance magazine for the second year in a row in October 2024. He received an A+ grade for his outstanding performance in inflation control, economic growth, currency stability, and interest rate management.

During his stint in the government, Das has also served as India's Alternate Governor in the World Bank, Asian Development Bank, New Development Bank and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank. He has represented India at international forums such as the IMF, G20, BRICS and SAARC. Das is a postgraduate from St. Stephen's College, Delhi University.
